

Construction Products Regulation (EU) NO. 305/2011

This is to inform you on **electrical conduits, DATALIGHT® products** as well as on the **cable protection programme** according to the

REGULATION (EU) No. 305/2011 OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL
dated 09 March 2011
laying down harmonised conditions for the marketing of the construction products and
repealing Council Directive 89/106/EEC

Article 1 General provisions

This Regulation lays down conditions for the placing or making available on the market of construction products by establishing harmonised rules on how to express the performance of construction products in relation to their essential characteristics and on the use of CE marking on those products.

From Article 2 Definitions

Any product which is produced for incorporation in a permanent manner in construction works or parts thereof falls within the scope of the Construction Products Regulation.

From Article 3 Basic requirements for construction works and essential characteristics of construction products

The essential characteristics of construction products shall be laid down in harmonised technical specifications in relation to the basic requirements for construction works.

The actual binding scope of application shall be determined by the listed harmonised standards or technical specifications.

Electrical products are **not** listed in the harmonised standards or technical specifications of the Construction Products Regulation.

Electrical products such as electrical conduits, switches, sockets, machines or other electronic installation components do not fall within the scope of the Construction Products Regulation.

Electrical products fall within the scope of the Directive on low voltage – Directive 2014/35/EU.

An exception here is Duplex Fibre 2.2 DATALIGHT, which falls under the standard EN 50575:2014+A1:2016 and is in conformity with the Construction Products Regulation due to the Declaration of Performance CPRDoP_001_Duplex Fibre 2.2 DATALIGHT.
